Manager's Report by Rob Clarkson


The Lake remains at full pool and our water quality is excellent. The busiest Holiday for our lake is quickly approaching. As we all head out to watch the fireworks on the lake lets be sure we have gone thru all the lighting on our watercraft. Navigation and anchor light are required after sunset by state law. Docking lights are only permitted to be used when docking not when traveling on the waterway. These bright lights make it difficult or even impossible to see the navigation lights of your vessel and create a dangerous environment for all when used incorrectly.

Our community has a 25 MPH speed limit with exception of St. James and Dam Rd. We also have Stop signs which need to be obeyed. Many of our residents are walking their pets, children are riding bicycles, and others simply out for a stroll. Our community should be a safe environment for all to enjoy without the worries of an errant driver changing their lives forever. Madison County will be patrolling our roads to ensure compliance.

The hard work our Maintenance Dept has done to improve our "Green Space" is evident now. Help us save maintenance costs by not driving into these areas when the ground is wet and by putting your trash in the receptacles. Please be respectful and give room on the roadways while they repair our roads and culverts.

Fence, Shed, Pool or perhaps a new home in your future? Don't forget your building permit. Building committee meets every 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month to








E FIREWORKS TO THE PROFESSIONALS

BE EXTRA CAREFUL WITH SPARKLERS

• Little arms are too short to hold sparklers, which can heat up to 1,200 degrees. How about this? Let your young children use glow sticks instead. They can be just as fun but they don't burn at a temperature hot enough to melt glass. Closely supervise children around fireworks at all times.



TAKE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS

- Do NOT wear loose clothing while using fireworks.
 - Never light fireworks indoors or near dry grass.
- Point fireworks away from home and keep away from brush, leaves and

BE PREPARED FOR AN ACCIDENT OR INJURY

- Stand several feet away from lit fireworks. If a device does not go off, do not stand over it to investigate it. Put it out with water and dispose of it.
- Always have a bucket of water and/or fire extinguisher nearby. Know how to operate
 - If a child is injured by fireworks, immediately go to a doctor or hospital. If an eye injury occurs, don't allow your child to touch or rub it, as this may cause even more damage.

Mowers Delivery Update

Rob Frey – The Association has taken delivery of the mowers that we ordered, one zero-turn and one finish mower for our larger lots. That particular mower is working out excellent as well as the other one. We are definitely using them a lot right now.

Fireworks

Dave Decker – The contract for the fireworks display was delievered to us at the last meeting and gave us the opportunity to read it for this meeting. The summary of it is our standard \$16,000 for display on July 4, 2019. If we sign the three year extension they will give us 15% product bonus. They offer different payment plans, if paid all up front we would get an additional product as compared if you paid half up front and half after delivery of service. Historically, we have paid half up front and half after service just because as a common business practice.

Tony Harris - Have we ever had any issues with them?

Dave Decker – The only issues we have ever had is the concern regarding clean-up of the area and who's responsible for what. As far as delivery, no. One of the things we are going to have to do is decide on a rain date.

Anthony Harrell – Isn't July 7th in the contract?

Dave Decker - Payment option. What do we want to do?

Shaun Diltz – I would be fine with the half and half.

Matt Ressler – I agree with that.

Tony Harris – What issues do we have with clean-up? If they have been doing this for a number of years, wouldn't we would know what to expect?

Dave Decker – I know back in the years we have had issues. I don't think we have in any recent times but I just know that it has been brought up in the past. Rob, any recent complaints about clean-up? **Rob Frey** – No, the company has done a phenominal job cleaning up the past few years.

Tony Harris – If there hasn't been any issues with delivery or clean up, wouldn't we want to pay for it all up front to get the extra product?

Dave Decker – My personal opinion is if I'm having someone do the work for me I would never pay them all upfront. No matter the great reputation they have or how many times they work for me. **Shaun Diltz** – Motions to approve to purchase half of the fireworks up front and half after delivery.

New Business

2019 Road Plan/Ditching

Rob Frey – What we have proposed for the 2019 Road Plan is doing some repair work with the patch machine on all of the roads. We are going to pay specific attention to Clover, Tamarach, Nassau and Westview, those will have more work done this year with storm water drainage and resurfacing, those places we will rebuild the road edges, replacing cross street culverts as needed to allow proper drainage. Tampico and Sextant will get a third coat of chip and seal which last year they had two coats. Spot repairs on Nassau with hot patch and asphalt along with chip and seal to sustain that for the rebuild in 2020. We will take out failed sections on Westview and south end, repairing with hot patch machine. Direct water off of the road way by fixing cross road culverts running perpindicular to the road. Excavate ditching below grade from the water surface to direct water off of the road way out of the subdivision. Replacing culvert pipes on the roadway as needed to obtain positive results from the ditching project. Our goal right now is to clean and scrape out every cross street culvert in the subdivision to clear brush or anything in front of those inlets and outlets along with adding rip rap if needed.

Dave Decker - Say that again?

Rob Frey – There are a few cross street culverts that have worn out and missing rip rap. They have brush and small trees growing at the inlets or outlets. Quite a bit of sediment has been found in these culverts so that needs to be cleaned as much as possible.

Dave Decker – In the entire subdivision?

Rob Frey – Yes. It has been an ongoing maintenance issue.

Dave Decker – I agree with it. I'm just trying to figure out how you are going to get that done.

Rob Frey – It's going to be tough.

Dave Decker – Are you just creating little ponds at the end of them because we don't have drainage all the way down to the ends.

Rob Frey – One of the reasons they are silting in is because it does not have proper drainage down stream. My feeling is if we have those culverts cleaned, we would be able to identify the problems down stream whether it is the culvert or the ditching. Either one of those senarios, they are holding water.

Dave Decker – I just didn't see that on this document that is why it took me by suprise.

Rob Frey – Understood.

Anthony Harrell – When you say rebuild our road edges, what does that mean?

Rob Frey – On the road edges, you see a lot in neighboring communities that the side of the road is broken rock. The road edge itself is ponding and holding water. The road edge itself is breaking away, there is not as much road structure there so we will remove the broken surface and replace that with chip and seal. If it is too far gone then we will just rebuild it, put in a new base and chip and seal on top if it. The goal is to stregthen it up.

Dave Decker – When you talk about cleaning the culverts, how are you planning on doing that? What method do you plan on using? **Rob Frey** – Water jetting pumps, hoses and culvert scrapers, which are made to clean out these culverts.

Dave Decker – Do we have that equipment?

Rob Frey – Yes we do.

Rob Clarkson – There had been a few identified problems where we had to clean it out already. Seems to work well.

Rob Frey – You are correct, Dave, it is not on the document but it is more of a general maintance task.

Dave Decker – It is not something we have historically done. So I would say it needs to be documented since that is part of our road work and ditching work. I'm glad you brought it up. I'm not putting it down at all, I'm just trying to understand. The resurface that you have labeled, we have a lot of different versions of resurfacing. What type is that?

Rob Frey – This would be your normal chip and seal. We would use a hot patch machine first and then chip and seal over it.

Dave Decker – So no rebuids at all?

Rob Frey – Not identified right now, no. I really don't see where a rebuild is possible.

Dave Decker – Just clarification is all. I'm glad to see us doing more

work on drainage. What I do not understand is how many culverts we planned on doing. I looked at the list of how many culverts on this document and there is three different lists of culverts with costs associated with it. When I added that up that is a lot more money then what you had in your proposal.

Rob Frey - I found these numbers from the ten-year road plan by Heneghan.

Anthony Harrell – One of the culverts on Clover was replaced two years ago.

Rob Frey – If it was recently replaced it will still be inspected but should not be on the list.

Steve Yates Jr. – The numbers that came from Heneghan probably reflected a difference in grade, heights of the road, edging and different culverts. I think you could find some savings in these numbers.

Rob Clarkson – These numbers from Heneghan also include them being here to oversee the job. That is why they are so inflated or at least I'm hopeful of why they are so inflated.

Dave Decker – The goal we had set at the last meeting was for you to get something together for a high level plan so we can at least look at the direction you planned on going and for us to see if there are any concerns. Does the Board have any concerns, are we looking at the right things?

Shaun Diltz – We are looking in the right area and the right things. Dave Decker – Does anybody see things we need to address in addition or redirect? The next step would be a more detailed plan put together. This is a good step. You had estimates here from an engineering firm, can you tell us more about that?

Rob Clarkson – I had called Crawford, Murphy & Tilly and invited Heneghan to bid a plan on drainage and road improvements. We are getting water from out of the subdivision so I figured we would start at the lowest part of the subdivision which is the south end and Heneghan said they do not compete for professional business. This company reached out and gave us two options. Option one was to completely stake out the job so a contractor would come out and review the job. That option was higher because of the hours they would have to come out and multiple job visits. Option two was doing this by GPS which was half of the price.

Shaun Diltz – I would see what the precision accuracy would be with the GPS method. It doesn't hurt to ask and find out.

Open Floor

Dave Decker – When I was reading the minutes from the last meeting about the silt stuff off of Jamaica that would access through our

lot that we own down there. We need to consider keeping that lot so we remain having that acess.

Shaun Diltz – Can we just turn it into green space? **Dave Decker** – Yes.

Matt Ressler – Motions to take the Jamaica lot off of the market and consider it a green space.

Shaun Diltz - Seconds.

All in Favor.

Bob Brakane, 537 – You have been talking about ditching and drainage, if you head up Prairietown Road by Possum Hill Road, the county just cleaned all those ditches out and went down Possum Hill. They did a fantasite job and was done all by transit and backhoes. With all this rain the water is draining quite nicely. The two beam underneath Possum Hill on the north end is bad and they have it marked. They did not want to close the road while school is still running but a few weeks from now they will be doing that work.



BOATING IN COMPLIANCE

<u>Legal Compliance</u> – "All watercraft operated on Holishor Association Lakes must adhere to and comply with state and federal laws as stated in the Illinois Registration and Safety Act."

Speed Limit – "The maximum speed of any watercraft operated on Holiday Lake shall be 55mph or as defined in the Reckless or Careless Operation section of the Holiday Shores Boating Rules. Operation of said watercraft shall be in a manner that does not create an exaggerated wake. Intentionally 'plowing' or 'pushing water' at speeds greater than no-wake, but less than those typically maintained while 'on plane' is not permitted."

<u>Watercraft/Registration</u> – "All watercraft being operated on Holiday and Su Twan Lakes must have a current state registration decal and numbers, one/current Holiday Shores decal, and lot numbers affixed."

<u>Operating Age</u> – The minimum age to operate watercraft on Holiday Lake is 12, providing the individual has passed a state certified boater safety class. Individuals between the ages of 12 and 18 must possess a valid boater safety card to operate watercraft, unless under the direct supervision of a member or a person over the age of 18, who has member consent.

<u>Watercraft Limit</u> – No member shall have more than three motorized watercraft registered to the same membership in operation at one time.

<u>Size Limit</u> – All watercraft being operated on Holiday Lake except pontoon boats with tubular bottoms, are limited to 22 feet in length. Pontoons are restricted to 28 feet.

<u>Traffic Pattern</u> – Al watercraft being operated on Holiday Lake must follow a counterclockwise direction of travel, similar to that of operating a motor vehicle on the roadway.

Boating Hours – Boating on Holiday and Su Twan Lakes is permitted 24 hours a day, but watercraft are restricted to No-Wake speeds from sunset to sunrise.

Noise Level Limit – No watercraft may be operated on Holiday or Su Twan Lakes in a manner that exceeds a noise level of 75 decibels. This restriction includes inboard/outboard motors, stereos, etc.

<u>Restricted Areas</u> – No watercraft shall be operated in any manner except prescribed for areas marked No-Wake, Swimming Area, etc. Holiday Lake is considered No-Wake when the lake reaches 9" above full pool and 16" below full pool.

Reckless or Careless Operation – Careless: No watercraft shall be operated in a manner that puts any person or property in danger or at a rate of speed that prohibits the driver from stopping the craft within a safe distance. Reckless: No watercraft shall be operated in a manner that willfully and wantonly puts life, limb, or property of another person in danger. This restriction applies to actions such as weaving through traffic, jumping wake when visibility is obstructed, following too close to skiers, playing 'chicken', or passing another craft in a manner that produces a hazardous wake/wash. This restriction also applies to the misuse of water skis, wake boards, or other devices.

<u>Water Skiing</u> – Water skiers, wake boarders, tubers, etc. may not be towed without at least two competent persons in the tow boat, to observe the individual(s) being towed and provide assistance if distressed/injured.

<u>Distance</u> – Operators must keep a safe and reasonable distance between their craft and other lake users, such as swimmers, downed skiers, fishermen, etc. They must also maintain a distance of 75ft from shore when making a wake. Seventy-five-foot markers have been replaced with new, larger white/blue buoys.

<u>Orange Flag</u> – Operators are required to display a bright orange flag on their vessel any time they have a skier, tuber, wake boarder, etc. in the water. The flag must be a 12 inch by 12 inch square and affixed to the highest point of the craft, such as a ski tower or pontoon top. <u>Racing</u> – Racing of any watercraft on Holiday or Su Twan Lakes is prohibited.

<u>Power Turns</u> – Power Turns (also referred to as 180s or 360s) are permitted as long as the following criteria are met: 1.) Craft is not unreasonably close to another craft, causing it to swerve or take evasive action to avoid a collision. 2.) Not done in a matter that causes the driver and/or passengers to be thrown from the craft. 3.) Not done in a cove or in a manner which causes a nuisance to another member. <u>Engine Cut-Off</u> – All watercraft (prop-driven and PWC's) equipped with an engine cut-off device may not be operated unless the device is properly functioning and it's lanyard is securely attached to the driver.













Medic Minute – Water Safety

Not including boating incidents, on average, about ten people die from drowning every day in the U.S. Some sobering statistics include: drowning deaths continue to be the second leading cause of preventable deaths through age 15, boys younger than 15 die from drowning at twice the rate as girls, approximately 830 children ages 14 and under drown every year with an average of about 3,600 injuries a year occurring due to near-drowning incidents.

Important safety tips to remember:

- Always supervise young children and those who can't swim it only takes a moment for the unthinkable to happen.
 - Don't let children play around drains and suction fittings.
- Don't go in the water unless you know how to swim lessons are available for all ages.
 - Never swim alone.
 - Learn CPR and rescue techniques.
 - Always have a first aid kit and emergency contacts handy.
- Make sure the body of water matches your skill level swimming in a pool is much different than swimming in a lake or river where more strength is needed to handle currents.

- If you do get caught in a current, don't try to fight it, stay calm and float with It, and swim parallel to the shore until you can swim free - remember that even rivers and lakes can have undertows.
 - Swim in areas supervised by a lifeguard but don't let your guard down.
 - Don't push or jump on others
- Don't dive in unfamiliar areas murky water can be hiding shallow areas or rocks.
- Never drink alcohol when swimming alcohol is involved in about half of all male teen drowning deaths.
- When boating, make sure everyone is wearing U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jackets.

If someone is too far away for them to reach with an oar, fishing pole or similar object, throw a life-ring or other flotation device for them to grab a hold of. Do not get into a situation where you need rescuing also. Watch for signs that a person is in trouble, such as suddenly becoming very quiet or if they have their head lifted up with just the face showing - they can't usually call out for help as they are trying to keep their face above water and breathe. Also remember that even bathtubs, toilets and buckets can pose a danger for very young children. Always practice proper water safety to ensure the safety of yourself and others around you.

BEACH AND SWIM SAFETY

HOLIDAY SHORES REGULATIONS

- 1. Beaches located within the Association are restricted to members and guests only.
- 2. Glass bottles, fires, pets and food are prohibited from the beach area.
- 3. Persons under the age of 16 are allowed swim: if being escorted by an individual 17 years of age or older or there is a lifeguard on duty.
- During each shift, a lifeguard is allowed a ten-minute break every hour, during that time, swimmers must exit the water.
- 5. Holishor Association Inc. is not responsible for one's personal items, nor any personal injury sustained while using Association facilities (water, beach, grounds, etc.)

IL DEPT. OF PUBLIC HEALTH REGULATIONS

- 1. Beach water is not intended, nor fit, for human consumption. Do not swallow beach water.
- 2. Beach admittance may be denied to individuals having:
 - Contagious diseases
 - Infections (foot infections, ear infections, vomiting, diarrhea, inflamed eyes, unhealed abrasions or lacerations, skin lesions, or bandages of any kind.
- 3. Persons under the influence of alcohol or behaving erratically will be denied access/removed from the beach.
- 4. No food, drink, gum or tobacco products are permitted in the swim area.
- 5. The use of glass containers is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Children who are not toilet trained must wear tight fitting plasticized/rubber swim pants.
- 7. Swimming alone is discouraged.
- 8. Diving in shallow water is prohibited.
- 9. Personal conduct that endangers the safety of ones' self, or other beach patrons, is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Swimming is permitted between sunrise and sunset, except during the times of thunder and/or lightening. Swimmers are required to exit the water during these conditions and remain out for a minimum of 15 minutes following the last detection of thunder or lightening.
- 11. Pets are prohibited from the beach area.
- 12. Beach patrons are not permitted to feed local wildlife or entice them to stay in the area. Wildlife harassment is also strictly prohibited.
- 13. Measures taken to protect ones' self from the sun, such as sunblock, beach umbrellas, etc. are strongly recommended.


