All Holiday Shore Public Safety officers are required to enforce the Covenants, By-Laws and Rules of the Association.

We also conduct public safety operations and have limited powers to operate under a basic set of operating guidelines.

A copy of the Holiday Shore Association, Inc. Covenants, By Laws and Rules can be viewed on line or obtain a copy from the office.

All members are expected to comply with Covenants and the Public Safety officers have the authority to issue citations for violations.

We also provide security for functions in the ball room, vacation and house watches for members. The lake is routinely patrolled

during the boating season and expressly utilized

during the 4th of July ski show and fireworks display.

Currently we have 5 officers and have a limit of ten. Most officers have a back ground in Criminal Justice, Fire and EMS. Our job

is to assist Madison County Sheriff Department,

Holiday Shores and Prairie Town Fire Departments and

Alton Ambulance service when requested. Occasionally we will perform a "courtesy call" just to bring to the home owner/occupant's attention that

they may not be aware of such as a dome light on in a vehicle, garage door open, unattended burning after dark or the display

of a "For Sale" sign on property. On Tuesday September 11th two new officers will join our team. Daniele Dix,

PUBLIC SAFETY

Our community is growing and Holiday Shores seems to be the “it” place to live. It began 50 years ago as a private community but as time went by the popularity of “lake life” brought an influx of families from surrounding cities. The manmade lake is approximately 435 acres stretching over two square miles. There are about seven miles of road Public Safety patrols every day.

Holiday Shores is a tight-knit community and if a dog is lost the first call comes in to Public Safety. It's incredible how fast neighbors work together to reunite pets and their owners. Please keep a recent photo of your pets nearby in the event it gets loose. Post it to the Facebook page for everyone to keep an eye out for it.



Crimes in our community are low so don't give a thief an opportunity. Many nights during patrol I notice garage doors open with everything in view. Occasionally a home owner will report that someone broke into their car that was parked in the driveway and took personal property. They will admit that they don't lock their cars at night. I have also been guilty of not securing my house when I would leave on trips partly because I fell into the mindset that “I live in Holiday Shores and nothing happens.”

As a community we must also police ourselves. If something doesn't look right, report it to Public Safety at 531-7923 or call the Madison County Sheriff's Department at 692-4433. It doesn't take long for us to receive calls when solicitors invade the community but help us to keep the community safe by notifying HSPS or MCSD of any activity that doesn't seem right.

Currently there are seven Public Safety Officers all with different education and backgrounds. Our job is to provide service to the community. We are responsible for the safety and security of the members, their guests and properties. While on patrol we observe the community looking for hazards or violations of the rules, covenants and bylaws.

One common citation that is issued is for derelict cars. You may see your '81 Chevrolet Chevette as a “classic” sitting in the driveway but your neighbor reported it to us because she thinks it's junk.

Holishor Bylaws Article III-membership section 2

- I. Maintenance of Property: vehicles/watercraft: Members shall not keep derelict vehicles in view of other members and the general public. Derelict vehicles shall be defined as any means of conveyance or transport that do not bear a current set of license plates, as required by Illinois law; or are not in such condition that they may be legally operated on public streets or waterways.

Effective June 1st, 2005 all homes and lots are required to have their lot number displayed on the front of their house easily visible from the street. Although “script” numbering looks pleasing it is difficult to read by first responders. Reflective large block numbers that are placed horizontally are preferred and it is highly suggested to have two sets of numbers on all houses. One set on the house and the other at the curb or driveway. For those members who are fortunate to have a waterfront property with a dock an additional set is needed for the seawall/dock.

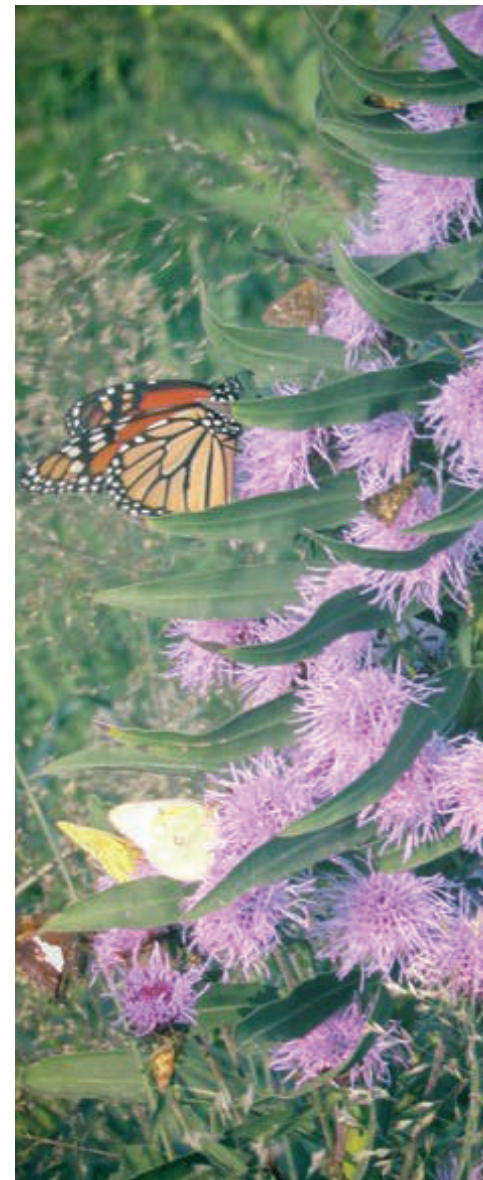

Trick or Treat Safety Tips

Look through the candy really well before eating. Throw away ALL candies with loose wrappers, or that are missing wrappers. Also, chunk any treat that may have tears or holes in the wrapper, or any candy that looks weird or might be a strange color.

Do not eat homemade goodies unless you know the person that gave them to you.

PARENTS: Take out any item that may be a choking hazard for your little one, such as gum, peanuts, hard candies and small toys.

Make sure that your shoes are on tight! Take a practice run around your house to see if any part of your costume might cause trouble. 2018 Road Rebuild Update - Sextant and Tampico

Rob Frey - There is very little on the road update. We are working with Hennigan and Associates to make up a final punch card for the contractor to go through and make some adjustments. There are just little deficiencies here and there that need to be fixed before we sign off on it. **Dave Decker** - And then the seeding is scheduled for September? **Rob Frey** - Correct. **Shaun Diltz** - What types of things are going to be on that punch list? **Rob Frey** - Right now we are

looking at one driveway apron being replaced. It's sitting too high above the road. When we get our first snow, I'm going to knock the blade off the truck. We also have some driveway culverts that were replaced and there's no dirt on the edges for grass. We're looking at adding dirt to those. **Dave Decker** - And then riprap and soil cloth for the ditch on Tampico? **Rob Frey** - Yes.

Algae Update

Rob Frey - We have not seen any algae and have had no reports of algae. **Shaun Diltz** - Is that just because of the copper sulfate or did it just run its course? **Rob Frey** - Yes. I think it was a combination of everything. I think the copper sulfate knocked it down at the same time our temperatures dropped and we got a good flushing on the lake. **Anthony Harrell** - And no follow up from the IEPA or the Department of Health as to how to apply the copper sulfate in the future? **Rob Frey** - Right now I'm still visiting with IEPA and I just got off the phone with the Department of Public Health today and we're still working on building a plan on how to handle this situation next year.

Association Manager Search

Dave Decker - The committee met last night and we did phone

interviews for six individuals. Of those six individuals, five made it through. We only had one that we chose not to take to the next step. We are scheduled to meet next Wednesday and have another six that we will be doing phone interviews with at that point. We continue to have more people apply everyday and as we get those, we are reviewing them. We've probably had a total of 40 applicants to this point. The next step will be that the committee will do a more full depth interview because the interviews that we performed last night and that we're planning on doing next week were just 10-15 minute HR interviews. We just wanted to talk to the people and get a feel for them and see how accurate we felt their resumes and applications were. So, five of them did really well, one of them was probably a good employee but just not the right fit for us.

New Business

Ecoli Update

Dave Decker - As most of you probably know, we are required

to test our beaches on a periodic basis. We tested our beaches and the main beach came back with levels too high to be considered safe so we shut down that beach. **Rob Frey** - These samples are taken quite regularly. We have never really had an issue in the past. We took the samples as normal and sent them in and they came back positive. IEPA said it could be a false positive and that they would come out and test it themselves. They came out on a Tuesday which was the day after our samples went through and they got the same reading. They told us to close the main beach by the clubhouse. That was the only beach affected. I asked them what the cause of this was. They said it was mainly the geese and the ducks spending too much time on the beach. At that point we let it run its course. We tested it again and sent the samples in. They came back this afternoon and said the beach was fine and the numbers are back down. At this point, maintenance is dragging the main beach by the clubhouse daily to cut down on the geese and duck refuge. We're trying to move them on. We are watching the other beaches. All three of our beaches are tested regularly. This is the only one that failed. **Shaun Diltz** - What is regularly? Is there a requirement that we have to test the beaches

so many times a year? **Rob Frey** - I don't have the actual numbers off the top of my head. Public Safety usually does those tests. I believe it's every 2 weeks. **Shaun Diltz** - Do you know whether it was extremely over the limit? **Rob Frey** - She did not have the numbers available. As soon as she gets those numbers, she will be sending them down to us. **Ali Clark** - If you want me to look at them, I can. I used to run tests on water. **Rob Frey** - Thanks.

Board Appointment

Dave Decker - So, we have an opening on the board. We've had several candidates put in their names. Board, I'll open it up to you for conversation.

Anthony Harrell - Motions to appoint Tony Harris to the open board seat.

Shaun Diltz - Seconds.

Jeanne Votruba, 493 - Two weeks ago, you opted to not appoint anyone because one of the board members wasn't here. 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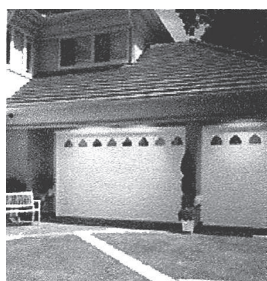
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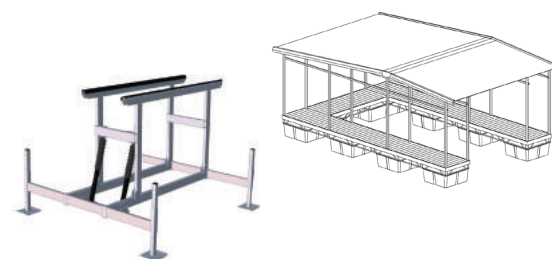
