Su Twan Dam Update

Rob Clarkson – I have drafted a letter to send to the property owners on Su Twan. I wanted your thoughts and approval before sending.

I am sending you this correspondence today to inform you that on or about May 31, 2019 we will be doing some work on the dam for Su Twan Lake. This work will require the lake to be lowered approximately 5'. Completion of the work will take approximately thirty days. During this time, our maintenance crew will be removing the 8" cast iron pipe routed through

the dam. If you have any repairs, you are needing to make to existing docks or sea wall this would be the oppurtune time to do so as Su Twan Lake does not get drawn down every five years like Holiday Lake does. Keep in mind any new construction will require a HSBAR permit. If you are wanting to improve your shoreline with soil cloth and rip rap we will have it available for purchase in the office. Upon completing of the work we will be refilling the lake utilizing the water from the main lake so we do not have to rely on above average rainfall to take care of it for us. Your water quality will not be affected, and we are going to do everything within our powers to have as little impact as possible on the aquatic ecosystem in place currently. Fishing will be closed on Su Twan until repairs have been completed and the lake refilled to normal pool.

Anthony Harrell – I think it sounds great, good job. Tony Harris - I think so too. Dave **Decker – I** think it is a good idea to let them know. We want to put something in the Holiday Times, obviously. I also think this is a good topic for the Annual Meeting for educational purpose for those who come to the meeting. Where are we on getting prices and estimates for doing this work. Rob **Clarkson –** I have the pump quote complete and ready to roll. I am waiting for the engineers to give me a solid number on our compaction, which is all I am waiting on. Dave **Decker –** You're going to draw that up with full cost and everything by the next meeting? **Rob Clarkson –** Whenever the engineers get back to me, I will get it over to you.

Absentee Ballot

One change in verbage was made.

Tony Harris – Motions to amend the Absentee Ballot to change 'or' to an 'and'.

Shaun Diltz – Seconds.

Mowing

Rob Frey - In your packet is a revised list of propsed mowers, these are out-the-door prices with taxes included. We still recommend the Ferris for the zero turn and we are recommending the GM1190 from Sloan's for the finish mower. **Dave Decker –** If \$3,500 from that budget line item. **Tony** I recall correctly, the zero turn is in our reserves and this amount of money is under the amount that is already fully funded? Tony Harris - That is correct. Dave Decker - The finish mower is not in the reserves and is not fully funded. If we are going to approve this, we are going to have to come up with \$6,000. We were provided a list of equipment that the maintenance staff feel we no longer need because we do not utilize it or it is no good. **Rob Frey –** Yes. Some of it is too expensive to maintain. Shaun Diltz – If you had up those estimated values, that is \$5,300 minus the scrap from the 72" flail mower. Dave **Decker –** If we decide to get rid of these then we get to have the fun conversation of the disposal method. We have options, we can do a silent bid, sealed bids, sell it on Craig's List, take it to an auction house, or one or two of these we can trade in. Let's start with the zero turn, since it is fully funded in the reserves. If we buy the Ferris, we will get rid of the 2001 Gravely 60" zero turn? **Rob Frey –** Correct. **Tony Harris – Motions to approve disposing** the 60" Gravely zero turn mower to purchase the Ferris ISX800 mower as recommended by the maintenance crew funded by the reserves.

Matt Ressler - Seconds.

All in Favor.

Motion Carries.

Dave Decker - The Finance Committee met on Monday and came out with a recommendation of a potential way to fund this. **Tony Harris –** We looked at the estimated values of the equipment to sell and took a more conservative approach, even though they are listed here for \$3,300.

Comfortably, we thought we could get \$2,500 for those hopefully more but at least \$2,500. The other \$3,500 we would need which we proposed taking from the Office Assistant budget which has no anticipated cost this year. Our recommendation was to take Harris - Motions to dispose the flail mower to purchase the GM1190 finish mower using the equipment sale funds and Office Assistant funds from the budget. Shaun Diltz - Seconds. All in Favor. **Motion Carries.**

Dave Decker - You have several items on this list of equipment that we might as well get rid of. The list includes a gas generator, lake mower, teeth for the 70" skid teer bucket and Ranch King pull-behind mower. Is this the only generator we have? Rob Frey - No, we have two more generators. Dave Decker - I'm expect they are in better shape? Rob Frey - Yes. The gas generator, the parts are difficult to acquire and it is not used. With it's size and weight, the output is very litte. The lake mower, this was mainly used eighteen years ago on Su Twan when we had a lot of lilypads on that lake. It is to be attached to the back of a john boat and moved around. We do not have a need for it. The add on teeth for the 70" skid steer bucket, we have not had a use for it. We have other buckets that do not have a need for teeth. With teeth, we have problems with utilities sometimes. The Ranch King, we pulled it with the ATV and cut some hill sides with it. We do not have a use for it, the zero turn mowers are taking it's place. Dave Decker – What method do we want to use for disposal of this equipment? I personally do not like the idea of putting this on Craig's List because that will eat up a bunch of time considering you will have people to come out and look at it and meeting with the people. For me, the options I see are silent bid, sealed bid or take it to an auction

house and have them dispose of it. Shaun Diltz - You are going to get more eyes on these items on Craig's List. You could get rid of at the auction house for less money. Dave **Decker –** If you do sealed bids, you will still have people coming out to look at the equipment. What we could do is set it out and set one day for people to come look at it. Rob **Frey** – I did speak witht the auction house, they have an auction coming up on March 26th. He said this type of equipment will attract a large crowd. We would have to haul everything over there, drop it off and they will help unload it. Tony Harris - Did they mention any fees for taking it to auction? **Shaun Diltz –** Which auction house are we talking about? **Rob Frey –** It is called Hill Top which directed me to Harman's in Shipman. **Shaun Diltz –** I like that, it is least intrusive. Matt Ressler – Motions to dispose the listed

equipment at the Auction House on March 26,

Shaun Diltz - Seconds. All in Favor.

New Business Sustainability Grant

Dave Decker – It looks like we were approved our sustainability grant to do maintenance work on rip rap on the north end and a few other spots. We need to make sure all of this work gets done and all invoices are sent to them so we can get our money back. For those who do not know, Madison County does a sustainability grant every year. Moro township allows us to submit our request through them. It is an 80% funded grant so we were awarded \$15,000 which we will have to come up with that other 20%. This is a very good way for us to get some work done at a relatively low cost. We have been doing this for four years. **Rob Frey –** I believe this is the third year we have been awarded out of four.

Dave Decker – This variance request is for a set back on a fence on a corner lot. I believe our set back requirement is twenty-five feet and you are requesting a set back of seventeen feet? Zach Harris, 1177 - That is correct. If you look at your photos we do not have a back door, just a side door and a side deck that comes off of that. If we went back twenty-five feet, there would be minimal space of functioning area coming off of that deck. We had three fence contractors come out and they all recommended twenty feet off of the house that was prior to knowing the set back rule. I read Madison County's rules and submitted my plans there. You have a copy of an email chain I was in where they said they did not have a problem with it. I met with the Building Committee where they gave me a variance request. I am asking for seven and a half feet set back. Anthony Harrell - How close would this come to the water meter? **Zach Harris**, **1177** – Six to eight inches which is right on the property line. Dave Decker That is where you are wanting to put it? Zach Harris, 1177 – Yes. Dave Decker – If you were to go with a twenty-five foot set back, it is basically ten feet off of your house? Shaun Diltz – What was it from the deck? Zach Harris, 1177 - Seven feet. Tony Harris Are you meeting the set back requirements on the east and north side of your property? **Zach Harris, 1177 –** Yes. It's just that one side. I got with my neighbor to the north and measured the property line and he has no problem with it. **Anthony Harrell –** My only concern is if the Sanitary District needs to turn on the water meter, they usually dig about two or three feet around that meeter to get to it. In your pictures, it looks like those sections of the fence can be removed if they had to work on it? Zach Harris, 1177 - That is correct. If they were to work on it, we would remove it and put it back in place at my cost. Dave **Decker –** Because this is a variance request, we ask the Bulding Commitee for their

recommendations on it. Their response was equally divided on this matter, half belive you should not be punished for owning a corner lot while the other half believes it can be an obstruction to the view of the intersection. Bottom line is the corner lots have to have a twenty five foot set back from the street. Zach **Harris**, **1177** – I could see if it was a wooden privacy fence but the pickets are three and sixteenths apart. The Madison County's assistant planner said she does not see an obstruction. Shaun Diltz - Is there a stop sign Shaun Diltz - Seconds. on the intersection? **Rob Clarkson –** No. Rob and I took a look at the property today and seeing where the fence is located and we do not see an obstruction. The is an empty lot so the whole front of the house is open. The only conern we have is if we ever went in and did ditching. That could be an issue down the road. Dave Decker - That is a road that needs done. Shaun Diltz - Would that road even be widened? Dave Decker - We have avoided widening anything. Rob Clarkson - If you are going to grant the variance, the request I would have is have something state he would move his fence at his cost as far as ditching goes. **Anthony Harrell –** Do we normally go further than ten feet from the road? **Rob Clarkson –** We don't normally, however, things lay differently out here from one street to the next. **Dave Decker –** The measurements that have here of seventeen feet from the road. Is that from the property line, have you had this surveyed or is this just from the road? **Zach Harris**, **1177** – I have not had it surveyed. I got with my neighbor where his property line is and measured eighty-five feet. Rob Clarkson - Have you found your pins? **Zach Harris**, 1177 – Yes, with a metal detector. **Shaun Diltz –** This streetlight is not in your fence, is it? Zach Harris, 1177 - No, it is not. We are approximately three feet from the street light. **Anthony Harrell – I** don't have a problem with this as long as you understand if we do any ditching or the Sanitary District needs

work done that any removal is on you. Shaun **Diltz** – I'm fine with it. He should not be punishied for that corner lot. There is a handful of them out here that look similar by looking at areal views.

Anthony Harrell – Motions to approve variance request with the contingency of the owner's responsibility to move the fence of event where ditching would take place or other Association requirements.

HOLIDAY SHORES REGULATIONS


- 1. Beaches located within the Association are restricted to members and guests only.
- 2. Glass bottles, fires, pets and food are prohibited from the beach area.
- 3. Persons under the age of 16 are allowed swim: if being escorted by an individual 17 years of age or older or there is a lifeguard on duty.
- 4. During each shift, a lifeguard is allowed a ten-minute break every hour, during that time, swimmers must exit the water.
- 5. Holishor Association Inc. is not responsible for one's personal items, nor any personal injury sustained while using Association facilities (water, beach, grounds, etc.)

IL DEPT. OF PUBLIC HEALTH REGULATIONS

- 1. Beach water is not intended, nor fit, for human consumption. Do not swallow beach water.
- 2. Beach admittance may be denied to individuals having:
 - Contagious diseases
 - Infections (foot infections, ear infections, vomiting, diarrhea, inflamed eyes, unhealed abrasions or lacerations, skin lesions, or bandages of any kind.
- 3. Persons under the influence of alcohol or behaving erratically will be denied access/removed from the beach.
- 4. No food, drink, gum or tobacco products are permitted in the swim area.
- 5. The use of glass containers is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Children who are not toilet trained must wear tight fitting plasticized/rubber swim pants.
- 7. Swimming alone is discouraged.
- 8. Diving in shallow water is prohibited.
- 9. Personal conduct that endangers the safety of ones' self, or other beach patrons, is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Swimming is permitted between sunrise and sunset, except during the times of thunder and/or lightening. Swimmers are required to exit the water during these conditions and remain out for a minimum of 15 minutes following the last detection of thunder or lightening.
- 11. Pets are prohibited from the beach area.
- 12. Beach patrons are not permitted to feed local wildlife or entice them to stay in the area. Wildlife harassment is also strictly prohibited.
- 13. Measures taken to protect ones' self from the sun, such as sunblock, beach umbrellas, etc. are strongly recommended.







MEDIC MINUTE

Severe Weather and Tornado Safety Tips Severe weather and tornadoes have been reported in every state and can happen at any time of year. Spring is the time when we usually hear more about tornadoes and severe storms. Last year 1,154 tornadoes were reported in the U.S., with 69 deaths and over 1500 injuries. Always make sure to tune into the radio or television for the latest information and listen for warning sirens in your area. A tornado watch means tornadoes are possible in your area and a tornado warning means a tornado is either on the ground or has been detected by Doppler radar - seek shelter immediately. Have a disaster plan and make sure everyone knows where to go in case a tornado threatens.

Prepare a disaster supply kit for your home and car including a first aid kit, canned food and can opener, bottled water, battery-operated radio, flashlight, protective clothing, extra batteries and written instructions for turning off electricity, gas and water. During a tornado: go to the basement or interior room on the lowest floor without windows such as a bathroom or closet. Get





under a sturdy piece of furniture or cover up with a mattress. If you live in a mobile home, get out as they offer little protection against tornadoes and you would be better off outside. Get out of automobiles, don't try to outrun a tornado – go to a ditch or low-lying area and lie flat. Stay away from fallen power lines and damaged areas. Every school should have a disaster plan with frequent drills. Basements, interior rooms or hallways away from

windows offer the best protection. Crouch down on your knees and protect your head with your arms. After the tornado passes, stav indoors until it's safe to come out. Check for injured or trapped people without endangering yourself and continue to watch out for power lines. A thunderstorm warning means a thunderstorm is taking place in your area. Keep an eve out for darkening skies. flashes of lightning or increased winds. Don't wait for the rain to begin to get to a safe place if you see lightening or hear thunder. Get to a sturdy building or car and make sure the windows are shut. Avoid outdoor areas if possible but if there is no shelter, stay away from trees, and crouch down in an open area twice as far away from a tree as it can fall. Put your feet together and place your hands over your ears to minimize any damage from thunder. Stay about 15 feet away from others if you are in a group. Stay out of water and away from puddles as they are great conductors of electricity. Avoid metal and drop any backpacks as they often have metal on them. Wait at least 30 minutes after the last observed lightning strike or thunder to resume outdoor activity. If you're indoors, avoid water and don't use any corded

equipment such as telephones, computers, appliances and tools. Stay away from windows, doors and porches. If someone is struck by lightning, it is okay to touch them since they don't carry an electrical charge. Call 911 immediately.

FIREFIGHTER'S FOOTNOTE

The past month has been a busy one for us. We have had several training dates including IDOT traffic management, SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus) training, truck familiarization, and live fire practice. We have basic pump operations and CPR/ AED training coming up. H.S. Fire Department responded to 28 incidents over the past month: four fires (one mutual aid), 13 EMS calls, eight motor vehicle accidents, one downed tree, one smoke detector alarming, and one wellness check. We also have our annual Fish Fry coming up on Friday May 3 from 4-8pm, which is one of our major fundraisers. There will be fried fish, bratwursts, hot dogs and BBQ pork steaks along with slaw, potato salad, desserts and soda. There will be a 50/50 raffle, and any proceeds we collect will go to Backstoppers in memory of Cpt. Ringering. The Garden Club also hosts its annual plant and flower sale at the station. Each year they spruce up the front of the station and prepare it for our fish fry. We will once again help with the Kids Fishing Derby on Saturday May 11th, and the yearly Holiday Shores Yard Sale Day is Saturday June 1, where we will offer maps and water with donuts for sale. Once again. volunteers are always welcome so come visit us on Monday evenings from 7-9pm. Follow us on Facebook or look us up on our website at www.hsfd.org.






